Practical things you need to know

Please do not bring in pencil cases, toys or nick-nacks from home. School will provide all pencils etc in individual pencil cases.

- A bag with a reading book from home for the first few days– during the first week reading levels will be assessed and a suitable book chosen in discussion with a member of staff

Entrances and Exits

Staff will collect your children from the KS2 playground in the morning. Please encourage children to line up sensibly and be ready ☺ Staff will bring the children down from classes at the end of day. We would be grateful if parents did not collect around the back stairs as it becomes very congested and we will come all the way out onto the KS2 playground.

Parents should not come up the stairs please at any time

The back stairs' door is automatically locked and unlocked at the start and end of the day so if your child is late to school, please enter through the school office in order to be registered.

Homework Expectations and Reading

Years 3 and 4 will be expected to complete a times tables homework and spelling homework each week, in addition to daily reading (please sign reading records). Homework will be set on Thursday and collected in by the following Tuesday.

Prizes/stickers for reads are awarded as each child accumulates multiples of 25 home reads. Some children reach 300 over the year and the progress they make in other areas certainly tallies with how much reading they do!

If your child has a phonics- matched reading book, they will also have a second 'love of reading' book. Though most children will have moved off the colour scheme by the end of Year 4 and may be choosing their own books even in early Year 3, from school or from home, we do keep a close eye on these choices to ensure good progress in vocabulary and comprehension. We tend to call these 'chapter reads' rather than 'free readers'.

We hope that both you and the children enjoy the new topic and have a great year. See you on the playground!
