Eco-Schools Topic	School Grounds
Aim Write a short explanation of what you hope to achieve.	Improve the school grounds so that there are a much wider range of engaging activities at break times. Bring children closer to nature and use the Forest School area during lunch times. Transform playtimes to improve children's enjoyment and well-being.

Aim	Be more explicit about the importance of global citizenship - that we care about all people, our planet and fairness for everyone (regardless of nationality, culture or religion).
Action(s)	<p>Work towards the School of Sanctuary award.</p> <p>Continue to develop Young Interpreters and reinstate language of the term.</p> <p>Conduct a STEM week entitled Grand Designs: Homes of the Future, which focusses on matters such as to how we can beat floods and hurricanes. In doing so, highlight areas of the world where people are already beginning to struggle more with these issues.</p> <p>Raise awareness and money for charities (e.g. Foodbank, Sport Relief, a charity selected by pupils).</p> <p>Celebrate Fairtrade Fortnight in school - assemblies, posters.</p> <p>Encourage our community to join Earth Hour (March).</p> <p>Celebrate Refugee Week (June).</p> <p>Display the UN Sustainable Development Goals - year 6 to make a poster.</p>

Aim	Reduce the amount of energy our school uses and encourage pupils and parents to do the same out of school.
Action(s)	<p>Year 5 to continue to be energy monitors.</p> <p>Celebrate the school's solar panels more to inspire families at home to look into their own installation.</p> <p>Encourage families to join Earth Hour.</p> <p>As part of STEM week, celebrate the use of renewable energy and highlight ways in which we can save energy at home (e.g. increased insulation, turning electrical items off etc). Consider sending out our energy tips again.</p> <p>Participate in Eco School's Cut Your Carbon (November - share before half term). Look into having an energy-saving week at school, during this period/STEM week</p> <p>Encourage pupils, parents and staff to reduce their digital carbon footprint by making a tips sheet for the school newspaper and newsletter - include things such as cleaning up inboxes.</p>
