

# Importance of Residentials

Going away for two nights is a big step, but it's really exciting and helpful for children. It helps them:

- •Grow in confidence trying new things.
- •Make stronger friendships working and playing together as a team.
- •Learn life skills like packing, keeping track of belongings and being independent.
- •Have amazing experiences outdoor activities and hands-on learning they'll never forget.
- •Build resilience overcoming challenges and realising, "I can do this!"

Children usually come back proud of themselves and excited to share their stories.



#### **Ufton Court**

Set within 44-acres of beautiful, ancient woodland on the Berkshire/Hampshire border, Ufton Court is a children's experiential education charity and one of the South East's leading providers of history and outdoor learning programmes for UK school trips.

## Overview of proposed residential

- Three day, two nights outdoor learning residential for Year 4 children
- Arrive at Ufton Court for 10am
- Depart Ufton Court at 1pm on Friday
- Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> June Friday 26<sup>th</sup> June 2026
- Examples of some activities that could be included within our trip:
- **activities linked to the Science curriculum** *e.g. meeting the animals that live at Ufton and classify them into different groups*
- **technology and engineering** *e.g.* build a structure to help fire a slingshot, work together to build a chariot to carry members of your team, craft a bow
- **personal and physical development** *e.g. map skills, geocaching, challenge wall, balance bridge*

#### Food

Children will be provided with the following food:

- Day one: lunch on arrival, afternoon snack and dinner.
- Day two: breakfast, morning snack, lunch, afternoon snack and dinner (fiesta night).
- Day three: breakfast, morning snack and lunch.

Fantastic at dealing with allergies and fussy eaters!

#### Sample Menu

**Breakfast-** Self-service with a choice of cereals (Coco pops, Weetabix or Cornflakes) toast with butter and/or jam.

Morning Snack – Fresh fruit

**Lunch** – Jacket potatoes with beans, cheese, homemade coleslaw and salad bar. Yoghurt for pudding.

**Afternoon snack** – Homemade cookie and flapjack.

**Dinner -** Vegetable Chilli in Taco Boats, Pizza, Naan Breads with Mango Chutney, Indian selection including Samosas, Bhajis and Pakoras.

**Pudding** - Fruit Kebabs, chocolate brownies and fruit crumble

#### Banquet

On the last evening there is a special themed banquet. This is a unique dining experience!

There are decorations with period appropriate props, children are welcomed to dress in costume to fully embrace the spirit of the evening.

The banquet includes banquet roast chicken, roast potatoes, corn on the cob and baskets of bread, finished off with a banquet cake and fresh fruit.



#### Cost

- Total cost is approximately £275
- This cost includes:
  - a coach to and from Ufton Court
  - accommodation
  - food and drink
  - all the activities

#### Next Steps

- If you would like your child to attend the residential, you will need to pay a deposit of £75 by 25<sup>th</sup> October
- This will be a non-refundable deposit
- The deadline for the remaining cost of £200 will be 28<sup>th</sup> April
- A payment plan will be set up with monthly payments of approximately £40 per month (22<sup>nd</sup> November, 28<sup>th</sup> January, 28<sup>th</sup> February, 28<sup>th</sup> March and 28<sup>th</sup> April)
