# Healthy recipe

## Fruit and Oats bar!



### Ingredients:

1 and a half cup oats  
 1 and a third cup honey/maple syrup  
 3 teaspoons raisins  
 Peanut butter  
 Vanilla extract

### Equipment:

Tray  
 Large mixing bowl  
 Spatula  
 Sauce pan  
 Sharp knife  
 Food processor  
 Cutting board  
 Parchment paper

### Method:

- 1. Prepare the pan.** Line the tray with parchment paper, leaving some overhang on the sides. This will allow you to lift the bars out later.
- 2. Combine wet ingredients.** In a saucepan, gently warm the peanut butter and maple syrup together over low heat. Stir continuously until the mixture is smooth and well combined. Do not bring it to a boil.
- 3. Add vanilla.** Remove the sauce pan from the heat and stir in the vanilla extract.
- 4. Mix with the ingredients.** Pour the warm peanut butter and maple syrup mixture into a large mixing bowl. Add the oats and raisins, and mix everything thoroughly with the spatula until all the dry ingredients are eventually coated.
- 5. Press into the tray.** Transfer the mixture to your prepared tray. Use your spatula to firmly and evenly press the mixture down to a compact layer. Pressing down firmly is key to preventing bars from crumbling when you cut them.
- 6. Chill.** Place the tray in the refrigerator and chill for at least 1-2 hours or until the bars are completely firm.
- 7. Cut and serve.** Once the bars are set, use the parchment paper overhang to lift the entire block out of the tray.
8. Place it on a cutting board and use a sharp knife and use it to cut it into bars or cubes.
9. Finally put it on a plate and eat it!!!
